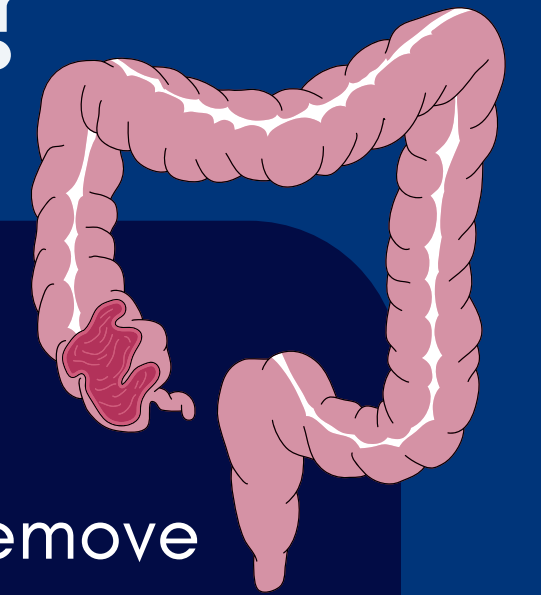


Colorectal Cancer Screening: Which Test is Right for You?



#1 | Colonoscopy

- A procedure that looks at the entire colon and rectum and can remove precancerous polyps at the same time. A gastroenterologist uses a long, thin, flexible tube to do this procedure.
- Detects >95% of colorectal cancers
- Normal Results: Repeat procedure every 10 years
- Polyps found: Repeat procedure every 3–5 years

#2 | Cologuard®

- An at-home prescription stool test that checks for DNA markers and hidden blood linked to colorectal cancer.
- Detects ~92% of colorectal cancers
- Normal Results: Repeat test every 3 years
- Positive Results: Diagnostic colonoscopy is required and insurance coverage for colonoscopy may vary

#3 | Fecal Immunochemical Test (FIT)

- An at-home prescription stool test that checks for hidden blood in the stool.
- Detects ~71% of cancers
- Normal Results: Repeat test every year
- Positive Results: Diagnostic colonoscopy is required and insurance coverage for colonoscopy may vary
